Open Enrollment Appeal – Open Enrollment was held at bay again this past session. We are thankful for all of those districts who have passed a BOE Resolution in opposition to Open Enrollment. The list has grown (attached) and now sits at 259 school districts opposed, impacting 454,600 student lives in Missouri. The list has been noticed by various legislators and it has had an impact! We are appealing to the other 257 or so public-school districts to take action and pass the attached resolution in opposition. Our hope is that if the number continues to grow, legislators will have to seriously consider the issue before casting a vote when the issue comes up again in the 2026 session. Thanks to Dr. Chris Gaines at EdPlus, Dr. Kenny Southwick with CSDGKC, and Dr. Pam Hedgpeth with GOCSD for their efforts in spreading the word. Thanks also to our meany educational associations for their support in this endeavor and for sharing information with their respective memberships. This resource is intended to support schools in their ongoing efforts to prevent youth suicide, respond effectively and navigate a suicide crisis, and understand how to engage with Missouri's behavioral health crisis services.

This updated edition includes:

- Strategies and resources available to help strengthen school or district-wide suicide prevention efforts and promote safe, supportive environments for students
- Information on how schools can utilize 988, mobile crisis response, and behavioral health crisis center services
- Updated, evidence-based suicide prevention programming
- New resources for parents and guardians explaining 988 and available supports
- Immediate steps schools can take in the aftermath of a suicide death

This guide complements the recently updated <u>DESE Model School Policy on Suicide Prevention</u> and is intended to be used alongside it to strengthen school preparedness and response efforts.



Note from Claim Care

Important Update for Missouri School Districts: Declining MO HealthNet Eligibility Rates Could Impact Services and Reimbursement

As Missouri School Districts begin the 2025-2026 school year, many are experiencing a significant decline in student eligibility for MO HealthNet. Claim Care has observed this ongoing trend across the majority of our districts, with the most substantial drop occurring during the spring and summer of 2025.

Why This Matters for Your District

Reduced MO HealthNet eligibility rates can directly reduce reimbursement through several state programs including Direct IEP Therapy, Cost-Based Settlement, and SDAC. More critically, it can jeopardize access to essential medical services for students who rely on them.

What's Causing the Drop in Eligibility?

The Missouri Family Support Division (FSD) has resumed its annual review process for all MO HealthNet participants. As a result, more than 1.5 million Missourians are undergoing eligibility redetermination—many of whom may lose coverage simply due to outdated contact information or missed renewal notices.

What Can Districts Do?

District staff play a vital role in helping families maintain coverage. Please encourage parents and guardians to:

- Watch for a yellow MO HealthNet annual renewal form in the mail.
- Update their contact information and report any changes by one of the following:
 - Visiting mydss.mo.gov and selecting "Report a Change"
 - Calling (855) 373-4636
 - Visiting their local Family Support Division Resource Center

What is MO HealthNet?

MO HealthNet is Missouri's Medicaid program, providing health insurance coverage for eligible children, families, seniors, and individuals with disabilities. The program supports school-based services such as therapy, nursing, and transportation when included in a student's IEP.

MDHSS – Tobacco Prevention Update

Thank you for being a loyal partner of the <u>Tobacco Is Changing statewide media campaign</u>. This campaign aims to educate parents on the use of electronic cigarettes and other tobacco products by youth.

We are writing to share the exciting results from the recently re-run campaign, which launched on April 1, 2025 and ended June 30th, 2025. Results **exceeded our expectations, delivering 44,406,138 impressions** compared to 33,486,296 impressions from the 2023 campaign flight. The campaign website and media kit were updated to include new video assets. All of the campaign materials, including the videos, social media content, post copy and fact sheets, are available to download for partner and public use from the media toolkit page.

Partners are represented through the video end slates and at the base of the <u>campaign website</u>. Users can visit partner websites by clicking on their logo located at the bottom of the website. Since the previous campaign, youth cessation services have been updated from Live Vape Free to <u>My Life My Quit</u>.

Missouri's new House Bill 2 allocates funding for qualified at-home reading programs. The Kids Read
